Columbus Dog Connection (CDC) is our neighboring partner with a mobile vet clinic (and professional staff) that provides a LOW COST Spay & Neuter clinic routinely in our community. In the past 3 years, you have supported our efforts to reduce the overpopulation of pets in our community by having your dog or cat spayed or neutered. THANK YOU!! To date, we have spayed and neutered close to 300 pets - this means YOU have prevented MANY unwanted & accidental litters! Sponsors are still needed to help cover the costs of bringing this unit to the community; the cost for renting a facility during each clinic is \$150. The cost to Rescue, Rehabilitate and Rehome an adoptable pooch is typically around \$200 - \$300., - typical for any pet that is part of any rescue group. Our adoption fee remains (currently) at \$145. because the community helps cover some of our additional costs through fundraising events. Expenses associated with fostering our pets include: vetting (basic and preventative...like heartworm and flea medication, spay or neuter), and much appreciated so we can continue with our goals of

saving lives, reducing the overpopulation of pets, and bringing resources to the community to help your pet

501c3 nonprofit organization. Your donation is tax deductible.

Frequently Asked Questions:

How do I rehome my pet?

There are MANY resources out there to help rehome a family pet or stray. We have provided a list of suggestions on the "REHOMING" page of our website Dream4pets.org

The more information you can share about your pet, (with vet records) the more likely your pet is to be adopted. There is a "rehoming form" posted online to help you describe your canine's behavior, temperament, socialization and health. Postings on facebook are very popular. We never recommend CL (Craig'slist) since many canines are pulled and used as bait for fighting, breeding or worse! PETFINDER.com also has a list of shelters or rescue groups you can contact. Most county shelters are established for the purpose of short – term confinement and care (7-10 days) as stated in the ORC. Owner surrenders might have less time IF the shelter is full or close to capacity. When there is no interest about a pet from the public or a rescue group, the life of the canine (family companion or stray) is terminated.

Can you describe the pets DREAM rescues?

Dogs in a shelter may have been dumped, abandoned, neglected, abused, OR relinquished by it's owner, or unclaimed because the puppy got too big. or due to behavior issues unresolved by the owner, or it could be a canine from a puppy mill or breeder that felt the dog wasn't worth breeding any longer. Some canines with a strong prey drive are "runners and explorers" (hard to contain stray), and some dogs are the result of not spaying or neutering. Training and vetting a family pet should never be overlooked or it's value underestimated. Many HAVE been in a home and with a family at one time!

Can you recommend any trainers?
